This year, staff, leadership, and volunteers focused on executing the first year of our strategic framework. As part of the year one–work plan, we worked to understand the needs of our members, learn how to provide the greatest value, and ensure that we can stay connected.

During the past year, we also launched the second membership survey and a new tool that allows us to have more conversation-based communications with you through email. Survey respondents believe the most important SPSP goals are as follows:

- Convene a valuable Annual Scientific Meeting
- Advance the science, teaching, and application of personality and social psychology for the benefit of all people
- Advocate for increased funding for personality and social psychology research
- Share research on personality and social psychology outside the discipline
- Be an inclusive and diverse organization that fosters the research and development of personality and social psychological science to improve society
- Highlight member accomplishments across social media through our #MemberMonday campaign
- Implement our #EveryDayPsych campaign, communicating about personality and social psychology research in a way that is accessible and engaging to the general public

We will continue to strengthen these areas and build value for our members. THE 2023 YEAR WAS UNIQUE AS IT ALLOWED US TO BRING BACK SEVERAL IN-PERSON PROGRAMS THAT HAD PAUSED DUE TO THE CHALLENGES OF COVID-19.

he 2023 Summer Institute for Social and Personality Psychology (SISPP) brought together 98 students over a two-week period at Ohio State University (OSU). Overall, students greatly appreciated the institute (8.66 out of 9) and plan to maintain the relationships built in the future. The Society of Southeastern Social Psychologists (SSSP) Conference brought together over 200 attendees in Charlotte, North Carolina with an 89% satisfaction rating. We also had to start planning for future SPSP conventions. A Convention Task Force was launched to determine the best path

Next year, we will continue to implement SPSP's strategic plan with a focus on evaluating our mentoring programs, addressing disparities and gaps in research topics, methods, and samples, as well as evaluate SPSP's carbon footprint and environmental sustainability. We will enhance the impact of personality and social psychology around the world, which will be bolstered by receiving Consultative Status with the United Nations. This designation will allow the society to provide expert analysis to the UN Economic and Social Council and reach a global audience.

The Society for Personality and Social Psychology's Annual Convention is the premier event for social and personality psychologists.

Attendees from academia, non-profits, government, and private sectors present and discuss research, network and collaborate on projects, and pursue professional development while advancing science and pedagogy in the field. SPSP also offers preconferences before convention so attendees may have the opportunity for deep-dives into niche research topics.

The 2023 Annual Convention offered a wide array of sessions onsite in Atlanta, in addition to a virtual program which attendees could access remotely. From a packed plenary agenda to informal roundtable "unconferences," convention attendees found new ways to connect and advance our field.



The 2023 conference marked the first in-person program since 2019. The event, hosted in Charlotte, NC, gathered personality and social psychologists from throughout the region to share their research, network, and explore opportunities for collaboration.



SOCIAL AND PERSONALITY PSYCHOLOGY

Every two years, SPSP hosts a two-week summer program called the Summer Institute for Social and Personality Psychology (SISPP), providing an immersive learning and networking opportunity for doctoral students in the field. After a pandemic-induced hiatus in 2021, SISPP resumed this year at Ohio State University (OSU).

rom July 17–28, 2023, 98 doctoral students gathered from around the world alongside their course instructors at the OSU campus in

Columbus, OH. Participants were divided into five courses, each focusing on a different area of psychological research, and also attended a day-long workshop designed to enhance their skill set.

ELIMINATING RACISM IN WORKPLACES AND COMMUNITIES

AUTHOR AND REVIEWER RESOURCES FOR PROMOTING INCLUSIVE EXCELLENCE IN PUBLICATIONS

Building on the Equity and Anti-Racism (EAR) task force report in 2020, SPSP's Anti-Colorism and Eurocentrism in Methods and Practices (ACEMAP) task force worked to identify top-priority policy improvements to advance anti-racism and global inclusion at SPSP journals. This task force has developed a collection of resources designed to help authors and reviewers meet journal guidelines and enhance the inclusive excellence of their work. Resources include guidelines and concrete examples for writing an effective constraints on generality section, how to report sample demographics, and helpful tips for inclusive citation and reviewing practices.

NEW MEMBER INITIATIVES

STATE OF THE RESEARCH

This year SPSP released State of the Research, a new report designed for those who want to leverage personality and social psychology research to address societal challenges. Developed by the Advocacy Advisory Board with guidance from the Government Relations Committee, State of the Research offers concise summaries of personality and social psychology research findings that can inform practical policy solutions. In addition to sharing the report with SPSP members and partners, it was sent to several Congressional caucuses.

This new resource aligns with SPSP's Strategic Planning Framework, which affirms our commitment to ensure that personality and social psychology is recognized, understood, and valued as a science that can improve the human condition.

SPSP COMMUNITY PLATFORM

In 2023, SPSP developed a new community platform for members to engage in discussions with and learn from their peers around the world anytime. The platform officially launched in January 2024 and SPSP is eager to see how members make the most of this resource. Known as SPSP Community, this platform presents content in the style of a social media feed and is a major update from SPSP's previous discussion platform (Connect!), which functioned more as a message board and email listserv. This new format creates a more intuitive experience and open environment for users. As the newest addition to SPSP's suite of member benefits, the SPSP team is excited to see how members engage with one another on SPSP Community in 2024 and beyond.

HERITAGE WALL

SPSP's Heritage Initiative celebrates personality and social psychology's impact by honoring some of the esteemed teachers and scientists who have made major contributions to the field. In doing so, the Initiative ensures the field's future by providing research awards to the next generation of scholars.



ONAL E. CARLSTON

Donal E. Carlston, a distinguished scholar in social cognition, has been a leader in the field for over five decades. Carlston's career included a faculty position at the University of Iowa, where he served as President of the Faculty Senate and received a teaching award, and later moved to Purdue University, becoming an emeritus professor in 2017.

Dr. Carlston's collaboration with John Skowronski on diagnosticity and spontaneity of impression formation garnered over 3,000 citations. Beyond academia, Carlston served on boards, advised organizations, and successfully published commercially sold games related to person perception. His enduring contributions were recognized with awards, including the Ostrom Award in 2009 and the Midwestern Psychological Association award for service in 2022.



NDA J. SKITKA

Linda J. Skitka is an emerita distinguished professor at the University of Illinois at Chicago. She received her Ph.D. from the University of California at Berkeley in 1989, worked at Southern Illinois University at Edwardsville from 1989 to 1994, and has been at the University of Illinois at Chicago from 1994 until the present. Her research interests bridge a number of areas of inquiry including social, political, and moral psychology.

In the past, she has served as the President of SPSP, President of the Midwestern Psychological Association, President of the International Society for Justice Research, and as Chair and a founding member of the Consortium for the Advancement of Social and Personality Science. Dr. Skitka has also served in editorial positions for several journals and has been recognized for her contributions to mentoring and advising.



MOTHY D. WILSON

Timothy D. Wilson is the Sherrell J. Aston Professor of Psychology at the University of Virginia. He has published numerous scholarly journals and books, primarily on the topic of the limits and sources of self-knowledge.

Wilson was elected to the National Academy of Sciences in 2020. In 2015 the Association for Psychological Science awarded Dr. Wilson the William James Fellow Award, to honor a "lifetime of significant intellectual contributions to the basic science of psychology." He was elected to the American Academy of Arts and Sciences in 2009. The University of Virginia awarded him its highest academic honor, the Thomas Jefferson Award for Excellence in Scholarship, as well as an All-University Outstanding Teaching Award.

CONSTELLATION HONOREE

Each year, SPSP honors legacy figures in social and personality psychology during the Annual Convention with the Constellation Program. In 2024, we will be recognizing the outstanding contributions of



DAN P. MCADAMS

Dan P. McAdams is the Henry Wade Rogers Professor of Psychology and Professor of Human Development and Social Policy at Northwestern University. A personality and lifespan developmental psychologist, Dr. McAdams is a pioneer in the study of life narrative. His theoretical and empirical writings focus on themes of power, intimacy, redemption, and generativity across the adult life course.

Dr. McAdams is the author of over 300 scientific articles and chapters, numerous edited volumes, and 8 books. Most recently, he is the author (with Will Dunlop) of *The Person A New Introduction to Personality Psychology* (2022) and also *The Strange Case of Donald J. Trump A Psychological Reckoning* (2020). His honors include the Henry A. Murray Award for the study of lives, the Jack Block Award for career contributions to personality psychology, and the 2006 William James Award for best general-interest book in psychology, for *The Redemptive Self Stories Americans Live By*.


