

## 2023 Preconference Submission Guide

All organizers/speakers/presenters must register for the convention at their own expense in order to participate in the preconference. Registration opens October 12 (no space is held for organizers/speakers/presenters so please be sure to register early).

### Convention Experience

The SPSP Annual Convention preconference formats are in-person and virtual. Please note which preconference you are applying for and the type of format it is. In-Person preconferences for the 2023 Convention will be hosted on February 23, 2023. Virtual preconferences for the 2023 Convention will be hosted on February 22, 2023. There will be no hybrid preconferences.
